## A Word From Pastor...



"(34) Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. (35) For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. (36) What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? (37) Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? (38) If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."" (Mar 8:34-38 NIV)

(1) Jesus called his twelve disciples to him and gave them authority to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and sickness." (Mat

10:1 NIV)

"(5) These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. (6) Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel. (7) As you go, proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' (8) Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give." (Mat 10:5-8 NIV)

"(14) If anyone will not welcome you or listen to your words, leave that home or town and shake the dust off your feet. (15) Truly I tell you, it will be more bearable for Sodom and Gomorrah on the day of judgment than for that town. (16) "I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Therefore be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves." (Mat 10:14-16 NIV)

On June 6, 1944, the largest seaborne invasion in history was launched by Allied soldiers in Normandy, France. Overnight, a military armada with more than 156,000 troops crossed the English Channel on more than 2,300 landing crafts. At 6:30am, troops began storming the shore on a 60 mile front. Known as D-Day, the battle was codenamed Operation Overload. The allied invasion of Western Europe overwhelmed German forces in an operation that proved to be a turning point in World War II.

We owe an inestimable debt to the soldiers who fought and died to defend our freedom this day. Allied casualties on D-Day have been estimated at 10,000 killed, wounded, and missing in action: 6,603 Americans, 2,700 British, and 946 Canadians.

Consider how we can learn from their example and continue their mission. In Mt. 10, Jesus sends the disciples on one of their first kingdom missions to proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is at hand (7). Jesus warns them, "I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Therefore be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves (16)". They are given authority to proclaim good new as well as bring healing into people's lives (1,8). They are to be strategic and godly, using the spiritual resources at their disposal to assault their spiritual enemy and to advance the gospel.

We are called by the Lord to follow in their example. We are involved in spiritual warfare (Eph. 6:10-20). We have been given spiritual resources to battle enemy forces (Eph. 6:10-20). We have also received marching order to spread the good news of Christ and to care for the lost. We have been called to deny ourselves and take up our cross and follow Jesus.

I encourage you to join forces with us in the coming weeks to participate in Harvest America with Greg Laurie on June 10. Invite unsaved friends and family to come and listen to the concert and to the message of salvation.

I encourage you to join us at the Cherry Festival Clean-Up June 13-17 as we not only clean up the park but interact with people and hand out free gospel tracts and Jesus DVDs. Be praying for the Lord to work in personal and powerful ways!

Before the D-Day invasion, General Eisenhower spoke words to his troops which are now inscribed on the National World War II Memorial: "You are about to embark upon the great crusade toward which we have striven for these many months. The eyes of the world are upon you...I have full confidence in your courage, devotion to duty, and skill in battle." Can you hear your Lord say the same to you today?



2lbs red seedless grapes

8ounces sour cream

8ounces cream cheese, softened

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>cup granulated sugar

1teaspoon vanilla extract, to taste

TOPPING INGREDIENTS

1cup brown sugar, packed, to taste

1cup crushed pecans, to taste

## DIRECTIONS

- 1. Wash and stem grapes.
- 2. Set aside.
- 3. Mix sour cream, cream cheese, white sugar and vanilla by hand until blended.
- 4. Stir grapes into mixture, and pour in large serving bowl.
- 5. For topping: Combine brown sugar, and crushed pecans.
- <u>6.</u> Sprinkle over top of grapes to cover completely. Chill overnight.
